## **Publication Ethics and Publication Malpractice Statement**

*Ex-position* is committed to upholding ethics of academic journal publication and requires that all parties involved (the editor, authors, and reviewers) comply with the highest standards of ethical behavior.

*Ex-position* boasts a collective decision-making system. **The editor** of the journal is expected to work closely with the editorial board in selecting articles to be published. The editor has the responsibility of offering clear guidelines to prospective contributors and reviewers regarding the journal's submission and review policies. The editor should ensure the operation of double-blind peer review in which the identities of the authors and reviewers are not disclosed. The editor should take reasonable responsive measures when ethical complaints concerning a submitted or published paper are presented.

**Authors** should only submit original research that has not been published elsewhere. Authors should ensure that any source used in the manuscript submitted has been properly acknowledged and referenced. Submitting the same paper concurrently to different publication venues is unacceptable. Plagiarism in all its forms is not to be tolerated. Authorship should be limited to those who have made a significant contribution to the conception and writing of the manuscript.

**Reviewers** are expected to follow the journal's review guidelines and evaluate a manuscript exclusively on the basis of its academic merit. Manuscripts received for review must be treated as confidential documents. Privileged information or ideas obtained during the review process must not be used for personal advantage. Reviewers must report to the editor if they are aware of plagiarism or copyright infringement on the author's part.
